

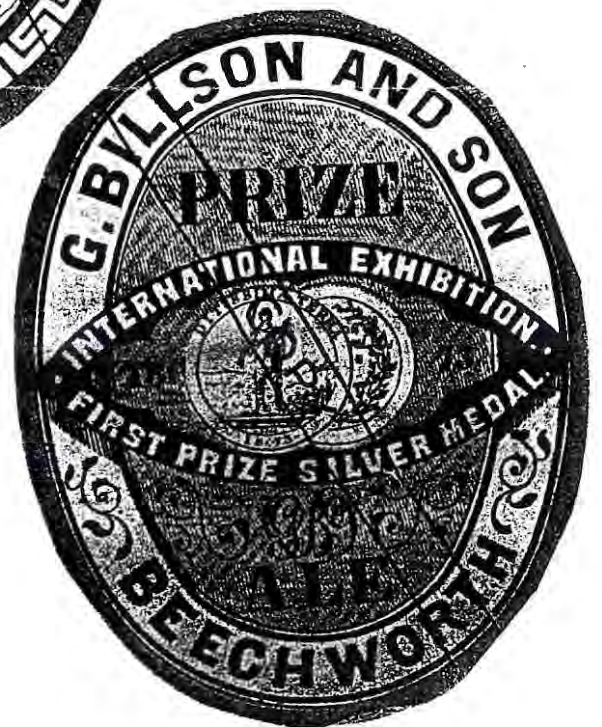
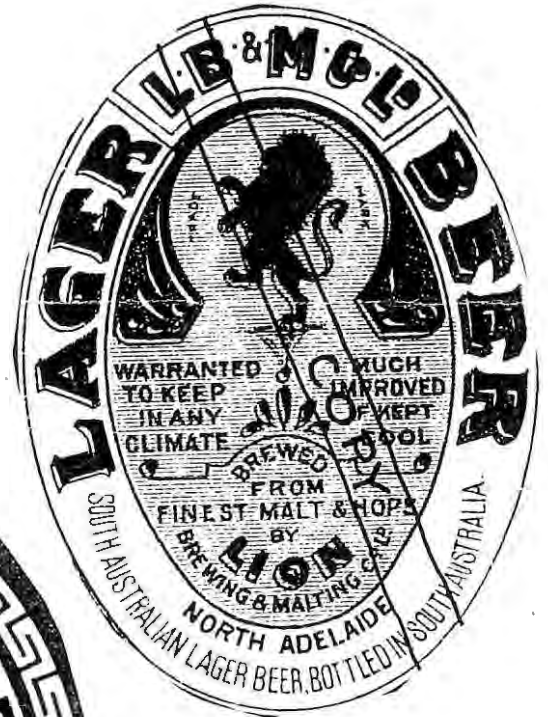
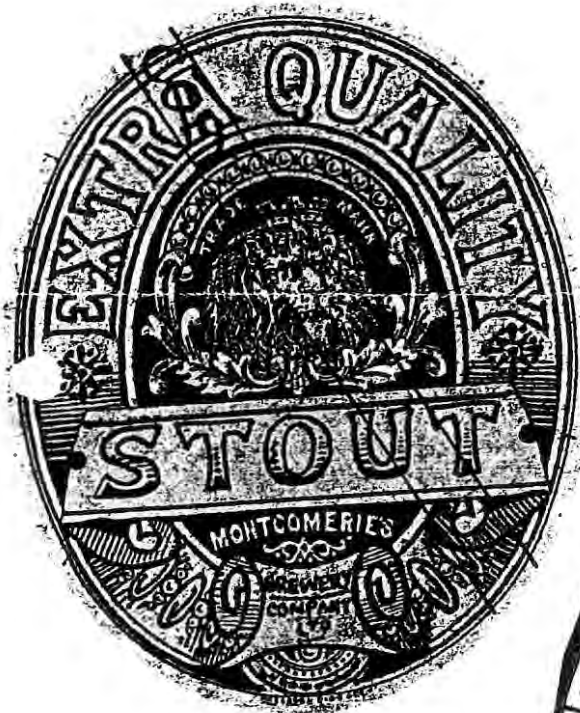

## BEER LABEL CATALOGUES

The Tasmanian Breweries Pty Ltd catalogue is finished at last, covering 46 pages, and is available for \$2.50 post free.

Also available is the Cairns, Toowoomba, Rockhampton catalogue, 28 pages - \$2.00 post free, and the Queensland (Brisbane) Brewery catalogue, 40 pages \$2.50 post free. Reprints of Castlemaine Perkins should be available in two months.

### COLOUR PHOTOCOPIES

Once again there has been discussion regarding colour copying of rare labels.

Methods suggested to identify coppies were -:

Reduced size, stamping photocopy on the back, and marking the face with lines and "copy only" or similar.

None of these methods can prevent skilful unscrupulous persons from preparing good full size copies.

(Although marking the face will deter the average forger - Editor)

The only two tests thought of, to identify the original from the copy were -

1. paper quality and colour - the old papers were quite different from photocopy paper now available.

2. lable edge - genuine labels are die cut and the same effect cannot be duplicated with a pair of scissors.

If any member can suggest other methods of differentiation, we would be pleased to learn of them.

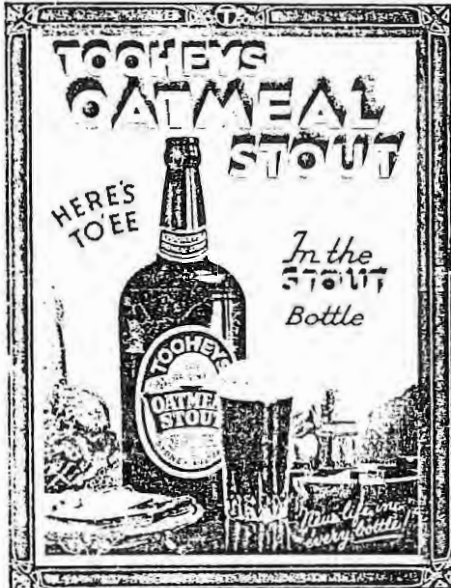

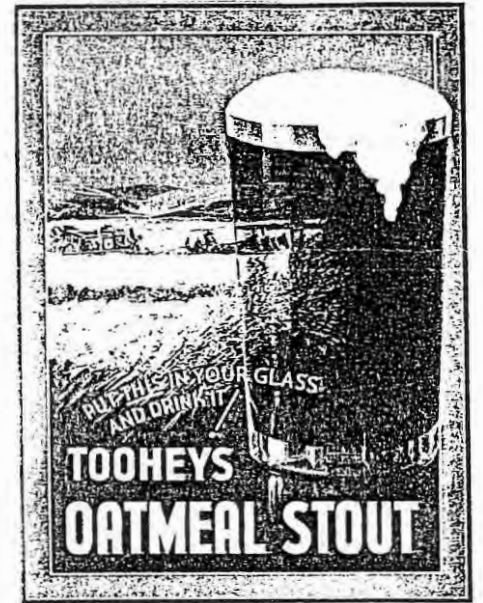
**BEER POSTERS**

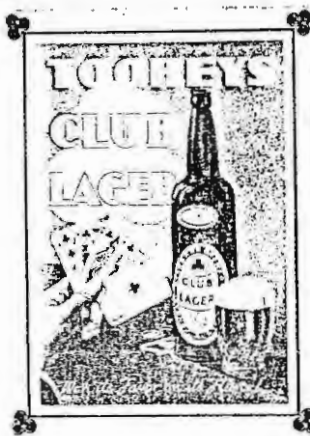


TS04 Flag Ale

# Methods Of Label Mounting

Following the reporting of the displays at our Melbourne meetings of album types and method of mounting labels, several country and interstate members have asked for an article on this subject.

Firstly, there are no albums specially made for beer labels and secondly, the type of album you use and how you mount the labels is up to you.

Most members prefer to mount by country, brewery, and beer type.

Whatever your system, one of the main considerations is that either the labels or the pages are movable, and preferably both.

That is, if you fix the labels to the page with a paste (water soluble) then the page must be loose leaf, whilst if the pages are fixed, then stamp hinges or slip covers should be used.

Sooner or later you are certain to want to re-arrange your collection.

Probably the cheapest album would be a foolscap size, two-hole, lever arch file cover, using 80gsm copy paper and mounting the labels with Clag, a dot in each corner.

Use one side of the page only, as the labels will rub each other if both sides are used.

One of the more popular albums is the foolscap size, three-hole, file cover, again using 80 gsm copy paper, and mounting the labels with stamp hinges. Insert the pages in light-weight Marbig sheet protectors to fit the three-hole cover; both sides of the page can be used with this method.

Another popular album is the so-called "magnetic" photo album, but if using these, then always have a slightly smaller piece of paper under each label, otherwise the plastic strips, will in time show through the label and the labels will also be difficult, if not impossible, to remove.

A further method is to use photo albums with the pages divided into label sized pockets and just slip the labels in the pockets.

Some members prefer a larger display and use loose leaf covers about 30 inch X 24 inch (750mm X 600mm), but albums of this size tend to be very heavy to carry.

Which type of album you decide to use is up to you, after all, you are the only person that has to be pleased with the result.

□ BEER buffs have given us information about how Toohey's came to use a stag's head as a trade mark (Column 8, June 16). Much of it points to The Bald Faced Stag Hotel, in Parramatta Road, Leichhardt, owned by the Hearn family from 1830 to 1970. The story goes that Abraham Hearn, convict of 1803 and later publican, kept deer, one of them a bald-faced stag, on a small property in the Five Dock area. On the stag's death, he had the head mounted and displayed in the bar, changing the name from The Australian to The Bald Faced Stag. Toohey's people who were friends of the Hearn family liked the head so much they borrowed the symbol, which eventually was registered as a trademark in 1909.



# The Lone Star Brewery, Tasmania

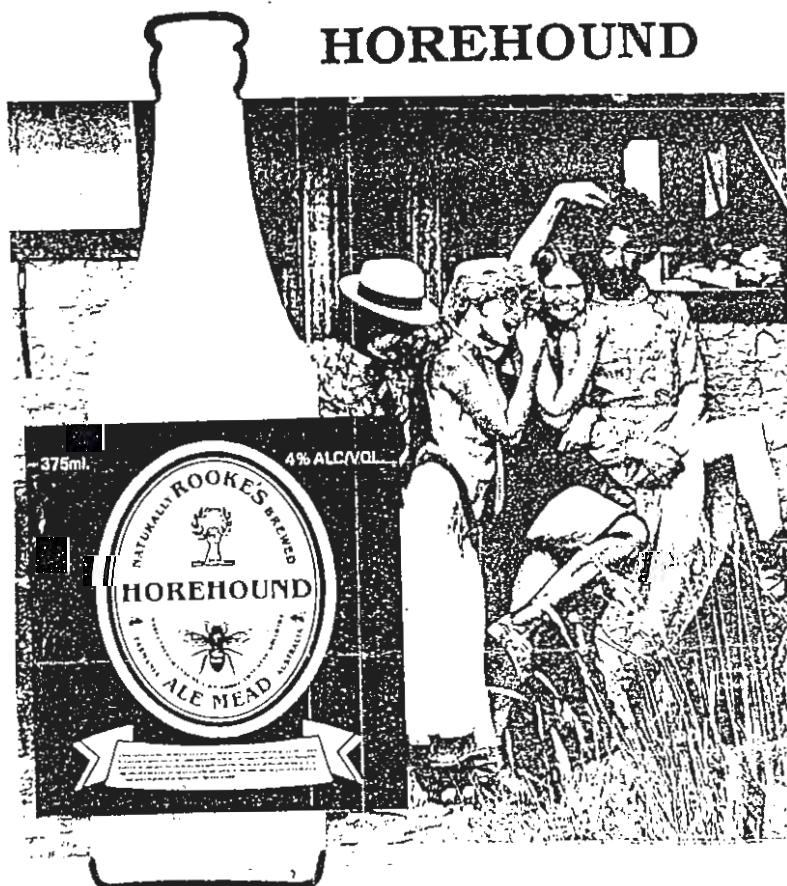
The tiny LONE STAR BREWERY is situated in a picturesque valley, surrounded by state forest in North-East Tasmania. This is not really a brewery in the beer making sense, as we don't use hops or malt to produce our beverages. Our Horehound Ale Mead is made with ale yeast, and the herb horehound, is used much the same way as hops would be used in beer, and honey takes place of the usual cane sugar.

The Horehound Ale is made in batches of only 140 bottles every 2 to 3 weeks, so you can see that we operate on a very small scale. The only other beverage we are selling at the moment is a 100 percent apple cider, and we only produced just on 600 bottles of that this season. The Horehound Ale is made with all natural ingredients and we are lucky to be able to use pure rain water and our own organically grown horehound. Likewise the apples in our cider are organically grown.

The brewery is part of our small organic farm, and although we've been experimenting with various brews over the years, we have only had a licence to sell alcohol from the beginning of the year.

Everything at the brewery is done by hand. The labels were designed by Jenny McPherson and printed by Regal Press in Launceston. Sales of our brews are only available from the premises, so if you are passing by, (our address is on the label) call in and try a natural refreshing Horehound Ale Mead or Cider.
